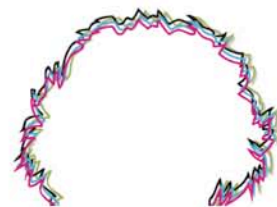

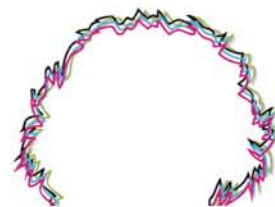

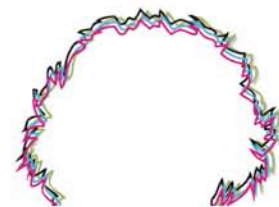

Résumé

- born in 1984 of a Catalan father and a French mother; grew up in the South of France
- started piano and violin lessons at the age of 6
- accepted at the Perpignan Conservatoire three years later, graduating with top marks in piano, violin, music theory/solfège in 1999
- in the same year, began his studies at the Yehudi Menuhin School in London, where he opted for the piano, studying under Ruth Nye
- already working with Claude Franck, Jeremy Menuhin, Mstislav Rostropovich, Dora Schwarzberg and Carole Cerasi
- since September 2004, he has been studying at the University of the arts in Berlin with Prof. Pascal Devoyon

- winner of the "Aujourd'hui Musiques" competition for contemporary music and the Jellinek Awards



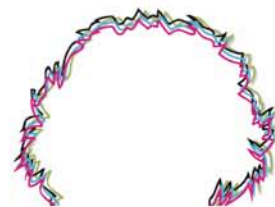

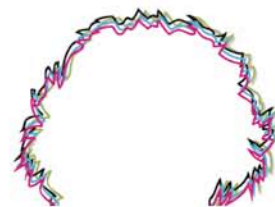
